STATE vs. FEDERAL

The unprecedented pressures on global insurance markets generated by the terrorist attacks of 9/11 and the major hurricanes of 2005 have set in motion some insurance regulatory actions whose end is not yet in sight. The debate about how to handle mega catastrophes, including the implementation of the Terrorism Risk Insurance Act of 2002 (TRIA), in combination with Gramm-Leach-Bliley Financial Modernization Act of 1999 (GLBA), has rekindled a long-smoldering debate between proponents of federal insurance regulation, and the advocates of the status quo, state insurance regulation. Circumstances are now leading to debate among three choices; (1) modest changes to the current system of only states regulating insurance, (2) transfer of insurance regulation to the federal government, and (3) dual regulation by both the federal and state governments. Our conference will provide deep insights into the debate with lively discussions among all the involved constituencies.
